- Poolesville High School was constructed in 1953. Today it is 65-years-old.
- A new, modern PHS is a solution to the overcrowding in other Montgomery County high schools.
- A new high school building would match the high standard of education provided at a nationally acclaimed school.
- The addition of an Agricultural Curriculum to the nationally renown Whole School Magnet would further enhance Montgomery County's leadership in education.
- Residents aging in place in the western part of the county are deserving of equal access to health and safety services.
- An integrated community center can provide crucial health and wellness services and support for the existing nonprofits in the area.
- Residents in the ag reserve - including our farmers - could greatly benefit from an ongoing police presence in our part of the county.
- A police substation co-located with a new high school would increase safety and security for students, providing peace of mind for parents all over Montgomery County who send their kids Maryland's #1 high school.
- The Poolesville community and the Agricultural Reserve would benefit from a multi-use facility collocated with a new high school and police substation to serve our population and currently underserved needs.
- It is appropriate for western Montgomery County residents to ask for a new high school and direct access to county health and safety services. The best solution is to collocate a new school with an adjacent county community center and police substation to share resources. This will create efficiencies through the leveraging of construction and operational funding while increasing access and quality services to western Montgomery County residents that need and deserve it.
